### We'll Be So Busy!

Math - Students will learn how to explain why a fraction is equivalent to a fraction by using visual fraction models, with attention to how the number and size of the parts differ even though the two fractions themselves are the same size. In addition, students will use the principle to recognize and generate equivalent fractions.

Social Studies - Students will learn about the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Paine's Common Sense, major battles of the war, role of African American soldiers in the war, victory at the Battle of Yorktown, and review of the key people of the revolution.

Reading/Writing - Students will read about poems and learn about the different types and parts of a poem, find the theme and messages within them. In writing, students will research to find information and facts about a topic they will do a writing piece on.

Science - Students will describe the repeating pattern of the phases of the Moon using a model. Students might think that the Moon appearing to change shape is due to Earth's shadow; however, it is caused by the relative position of the Moon and the Sun.
