We'll Be So Busy!

Math - Students will continue to learn how to use place value and equivalent fractions to add two fractions with respective denominators of 10 and 100. Students will use that knowledge to compare and order fractions to hundredths by reasoning about their size.

Social Studies - Students will continue to learn about the Bill of Rights and identify the rights protected by the first 10 amendments. They will also explain the roles Washington, Morris, Madison, Mason, Franklin, and Hamilton played in the Constitutional Convention. They will demonstrate their knowledge about the 3 branches of government and the U.S. Constitution by playing a relay game and scavenger hunt.

Reading/Writing - Students will continue to review main idea and summarizing skills. In writing, students will be begin persuasive/opinion writings.

Science - Students will begin a unit on comparing stars with planets. They will investigate how astronomers determine whether an object in the sky is a star or a planet. Students will identify why constellation patterns appear to stay the same, why planets change position often in comparison to the constellations, and how the stars and planets are different. A short guiz will be administered on Friday.
