We'll Be So Busy!

Math - Students will learn how to estimate and measure length using customary units, convert customary units of length and record measurement equivalents in a two-column table.

Social Studies - Students will explain the role of the 1st president and outcomes of President Washington's term. On Wednesday, students will take the Building a New Nation Test. Then, we will begin our unit on the Westward Expansion. Students will learn key vocabulary and explain the causes and effects of the War of 1812.

Reading/Writing - Students will continue to write persuasive and opinion writings. Students will also read informational writing to find the theme and practice summarizing.

Science - Students will explain that The Sun is at the center of our solar system. Its strong gravitational pull holds eight major planets (Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune) and other celestial objects in orbit around it.
