We'll Be So Busy!

Math - Students will generate a number or shape pattern that follows a given rule and identify apparent features of the pattern that were not explicit in the rule itself. Please remind students to review their math notes and study guide for the Benchmark 2 Test (Chapter 4-6) on November 14.

Social Studies - Students will continue to learn about personal finance and the elements of a personal budget. They will take the Personal Finance test on Friday, November 30^{th} .

Language Arts - In reading, students will learn to identify the perspective and point of view, and use context clues to identify meaning of words. In grammar, students will continue to write and identify vivid verbs used to show personification. In writing, students will rewrite their paragraphs neatly on notebook paper or type it on the computer to glue on a large piece of construction paper to make their mini-magazine. They will draw or glue photographs of pictures related to their topics.

Science – Students will continue to learn about tools such as thermometers, rain gauges, wind vanes, barometers, and anemometers can be used to gather weather data. Patterns can be observed in weather data and can be used to make predictions about future weather. Weather describes the conditions outside at a certain place and time while climate describes the general conditions over a long period of time. The Weather and Climate test will be on Friday, November 30th.
