



Afterwards, click on Standard Online Tools and then click on Grades 3-5. The username and password will be listed above the username and password boxes. There is no answer key for the questions. Students need to be familiarized with the online tools and how to answer the questions. Typing will be an essential skill they need to practice.

Math - Students will learn how to apply the perimeter and area formulas for rectangles in real world and mathematical problems.
