We'll Be So Busy!

Math - Students will continue to identify different types of triangles, angles, and quadrilaterals.

Social Studies - In social studies, students will identify Uncle Tom's Cabin and John Brown's Raid on Harper's Ferry and explain how each of these events was related to the Civil War. We will discuss how the issues of state's rights and slavery increased tensions between the North and the South. Students will identify the major battles, campaigns, and events: Fort Sumter, Gettysburg, the Atlanta campaign, Sherman's March to the sea, and Appomattox courthouse. Students will study the roles of Abraham Lincoln, Robert E. Lee, Ulysses S. Grant, Jefferson Davis, Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson and William T. Sherman.

Language Arts - In reading, students will continue to compare and contrast the similar treatment of the theme and patterns of events (plot) in different versions of Little Red Riding Hood. In grammar, students will identify the simple subject and predicate in the simple sentence. In writing, students will continue to work on their mini-magazine. They will begin writing their final drafts and design the layout of their magazine.

Science - In science, we will plan and carry out an investigation utilizing everyday objects to produce sound and predict the effects changing the strength or speed of vibrations.
